

Canada Child Tax Benefit – Statement of Income

Tax year

Use this form if you are receiving the Canada child tax benefit (CCTB) and your spouse or common-law partner was a non-resident of Canada for tax purposes for any part of the tax year you indicated above.

We will use this information to calculate your CCTB payments. To continue receiving the CCTB, you have to complete this form and send it to us after each year (or part of a year) that your spouse or common-law partner was a non-resident of Canada.

Enter, in the "Tax year" box above, the year your spouse or common-law partner was a non-resident.

Section 1 – Information about the CCTB applicant. Fields include: First name and initial, Last name, Social insurance number, Mailing address, City, Province or territory, Postal code, Home address, Home telephone number, Work telephone number.

Section 2 – Information about your spouse or common-law partner. Fields include: First name and initial, Last name, Social insurance number, Date of birth, Tick this box if your spouse or common-law partner does not have a social insurance number, Mailing address, City, Province or territory, Postal code.

Section 3 – Statement of income. Complete Part A, B or C, whichever applies. Enter your spouse or common-law partner's income in Canadian dollars from all sources inside and outside of Canada.

Part A – Non-resident of Canada for the whole year. If your spouse or common-law partner was a non-resident of Canada for the whole tax year, enter his or her income for the whole tax year: \$ _____

Part B – Became a non-resident of Canada in the year. If your spouse or common-law partner became a non-resident of Canada in the tax year, enter the date he or she became a non-resident: Year Month Day

Enter his or her income for the part of the tax year that he or she was a non-resident of Canada: \$ _____

Part C – Became a resident of Canada in the year. If your spouse or common-law partner became a resident of Canada in the tax year, enter the date he or she became a resident: Year Month Day
